

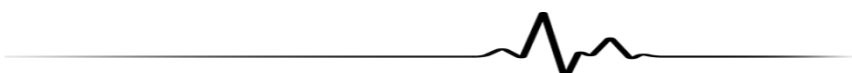

There is a growing realization that in the current phase of globalization, disruptive technologies and innovative governance arrangements will not only impact livelihood patterns and complexities of fiscal risk management but also can play a critical constructive role in sustaining of social sector policies with good outcomes in terms of coverage, level of benefits in the aggregate by all schemes and programs, with economic and fiscal jurisprudence. This conference aims to explore the selected pension and healthcare issues in the above context.

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## *dialogue 2016*

### **A Competitive India – alternate realities**

The Global Competitiveness Index (GCI), published by the World Economic Forum, broadly classifies economies / countries on the basis of development stage – as Factor driven economies, as Efficiency driven economies or as Innovation driven economies. This classification is useful in understanding differences in competitive dynamics within homogenous settings, in countries that have broadly uniform achievement of factor, efficiency &/ sophistication determinants. These 3 pillars are further made of specific determinants. Please see table in the next page for an illustration of what the constituent elements are of these 3 individual pillars.

While the GCI framework has been broadly applied to India, our view is that in India and indeed in some other parts of the world, to varying extents, a more nuanced approach to competitiveness has to be employed for it to be useful descriptively and prescriptively. Our view is that in India for instance, different parts of the economy, different locations and different political / historicity have resulted in hybrid realities, i.e., the Innovation Cluster in Bengaluru is home to half of all TNC R&D facilities in India with over 150,000 highly skilled research specialists working from within a 30 km radius, the Auto cluster around Chennai is efficiency driven, driven by availability of skilled workers and active government / institutional facilitation and the Agro cluster in the Gangetic belt for instance is still very factor led.

In this edition of Dharitri Dialogues, we will discuss and debate, together with leading scholars and experts from various academic disciplines and accomplished practitioners, some aspects that are determinants of competitiveness, the interesting parallel realities that characterise India and what the likely interplay of certain determinants is likely to be and how these outcomes will define different possible trajectories for India's future.
